Cookies Policy

Access to this website may involve the use of cookies. Cookies are small text files that are placed onto your computer or electronic device by a website. Similar technologies include action tags, web beacons, single-pixel gifs and local shared objects ('flash cookies'). Cookies can be used to track the actions and activities of users, and to store information about them. Among other things, cookies help us to understand user behaviour and may also, for example, help to identify and resolve errors. Thus cookies make browsing easier and more user-friendly, and note they do not damage the navigation device. The cookies that allow the identification of a person are considered personal data, and therefore, the Privacy Policy detailed on our website will apply to them. By using our website, you agree to us using cookies as set out in this policy.

When you visit our website, information that can be collected and stored may include the internet domain and IP address from where you access our website; the type of browser software and operating system used to access our website; the date and time of the visit; the pages viewed; the time spent on the website; and the sites visited just before and after the visit. No cookies allow contact to the user's phone number or any other means of personal contact, and no cookie can extract information from the user's hard drive or steal personal information. The only way that the user's private information may form part of the cookie file is for the user to personally give that information to the server. Cookies can be set by the owner of the website you are visiting, and these are known as 1st Party Cookies. In addition, there are 3rd Party Cookies that can be set by partner websites.

You can disable, reject, and delete cookies -totally or partially- through the configuration of your browser, examples of which include Google Chrome, Firefox, Safari and Internet Explorer. In this regard, the procedures for rejecting and deleting cookies may differ from one Internet browser to another. Consequently, you must go to the instructions provided by the internet browser that you are using. In the event that you reject the use of cookies -totally or partially- you may continue to use the website, although you may have limited use of some features.
